FBI, USCG investigate rape

SOUTH PORTLAND — FBI and U.S. Coast Guard investigators are expected to complete an investigation this week into a Portland woman's complaint she was raped by Coast Guard personnel aboard the Coast Guard Cutter Spar here last weekend.

Lt. Peter Blaisdell, a public affairs officer for the 1st Coast Guard District in Boston, said in a press release the alleged incident reportedly occurred late Friday and early Saturday after the woman had been invited aboard the vessel.

The Spar is an 180-foot buoy-tender with a crew of 48. Blaisdell said he believes the investigation will focus on more than a single crew member.
